

Ans: The AACN recommends that schools hire diversity program managers; provide support services to minority students; provide and support bridging programs from 2-year degrees to 4-year degrees; enhance admission processes, cultural competence, and minority student recruitment; remove financial barriers; and increase diversity program funding by Congress. Students can discuss personal experiences in the workforce today and relate to these recommendations.

Ans: Florence Nightingale's definition was related to caring for someone's health no matter what, putting the person in the best possible condition for nature to act upon him. Virginia Henderson focused on doing for the patient what he would do for himself if he were able, and to help him gain independence. Martha Rogers focused on assisting a human being to achieve maximum health within his or her own potential. The ANA and the ICN focus on autonomous nurses caring for the protection, promotion, and optimization of health, all while collaborating with a healthcare team. The role of the nurse, as well as the role of a woman, has altered this definition over time. The change in culture from a focus on illness to a focus on health has also been important. Furthermore, teamwork and collaboration among healthcare providers at all levels have become truly important in the complex healthcare environment.
