Suggested answer: Sample response: A company can have more engaged employees when they know they are part of an ethical brand and are doing their part to protect future generations. In addition, sustainability can serve as a competitive advantage within their industry. More and more customers are concerned with environmental effects and are supporting brands accordingly. As government regulations evolve, a business may also have less difficulty meeting compliancy standards.

Catastrophe theory examines how thresholds are exceeded and the transitions that occur between periods of stability.

You are the executive director of an art center that offers merchandise, classes, and gallery shows. Describe three categories of sustainability values that you would incorporate, providing an example of each.

Suggested answer: Sample response: As executive director, it is important that I implement resource management values to reduce waste. An example of this would be to hold multiple events simultaneously in different areas. This would allow for full advantage of electricity and other utilities. This could also demand fewer driving trips for patrons, reducing automobile emissions. In terms of ethical values for sustainability, I would ensure that all materials and products used are environmentally sustainable and that all merchandise comes from fair-trade vendors providing a living wage to artisans. Preventive values can be incorporated by changing product offerings as additional information is discovered, as well as adapting to customer needs and environmentally friendly practices. Offering virtual events and classes would adapt to patrons who may not be able to attend in person while also eliminating the travel requirement.
